HISTORY OF FRIENDLY RELATIONS AND MUTUAL SUPPORT

On September 15, 2021, celebrating the National Holiday and 75 years of diplomatic relations between Mexico and Serbia, the Embassy of Mexico in Belgrade organized a ceremony in the Embassy building, attended by the Mexican people and friends of the Embassy, including Ivana Milosavljevic, Dipos Deputy Director, and Jovan Roganovic, Technical Service Director.

Bilateral relations between the Republic of Hungary and the Republic of Serbia

UNITED IN BUILDING CENTRAL EUROPE

Although the relations between the Serbs and the Hungarians have been very turbulent throughout history, the fact that Serbia and Hungary have an agreement on the shared use of the premises of diplomatic and consular missions in the world is perhaps the best proof of today's friendly viewpoints.



During the 6th joint session of the two governments held in September 2021, the Prime Minister of Hungary, Viktor Orbán, stated that the signed Agreement on cordial relations and strategic partnership between the two countries is one of the most important "on the historical horizon" of all the agreements that he signed. On the other hand, the Prime Minister of Serbia, Ana Brnabic, stated on this occasion that Hungary is "Serbia's most reliable partner on the European path."

It was also pointed out that Hungary has become Serbian third largest economic and trade partner within the European Union, and that the trade exchange between Serbia and Hungary, despite the corona virus pandemic, increased significantly in 2020.

SERBIAN DIPLOMATS

JEVREM GRUJIC – INITIATOR OF SERBIAN LIBERALISM –

Jevrem Grujic, Serbian statesman and diplomat, was a minister, judge of the Grand Court and a diplomatic representative of Serbia in Constantinople, London, Paris and Brussels. During his long career, he significantly contributed to Serbian diplomacy, education and legislation.

Due to his efforts and support, the First Law on the National Assembly, the foundation of modern democracy and parliamentarism in Serbia, was passed in 1858.





During the 19th and 20th centuries, city balls were organized in the salons of this luxurious villa, where the social, intellectual and political elite which was deciding on the future of Serbia gathered. Jovan Ducic, Milan Rakic, Jovan Cvijic, Simo Matavulj, Jovan Skerlic, Paja Jovanovic, Milan Rakic, and Uros Predic were common guests here... Queen Marija Karadjordjevic used to come unannounced and without any protocol. A secret agreement between Serbia and Bulgaria for the liberation of the South Slavs in 1912, the document upon which the Balkan Alliance was formed, was even signed here.
